



Nikon Coolpix S630 Lens Replacement

This guide will show you how to replace the Nikon Coolpix S630 Lens.



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Step 1 — Battery Compartment




- The battery compartment is located on the bottom of the camera.
- Place your thumb on the battery door.
- Slide the door away from the camera in the direction the arrow points to.

Step 2 — Battery



- Slide the yellow tab towards the back of the camera.
- The battery should pop out.
- Remove the battery.

Step 3 — Memory Card




- Press the memory card down into the camera.
- The memory card should pop out.
- Remove the memory card.

Step 4 — Back Cover Removal





- Unscrew the two 3.5mm Phillips screws from the side with the AV outlet.
- Unscrew the 3.5mm Phillips screw from the opposite side of the camera.
- Unscrew the six 3.5mm Phillips screws from the bottom of the camera.

Step 5




- Carefully remove the back casing from the camera.
- ⚠ Be mindful when removing the back casing as there is a ribbon that still connects the back casing to the motherboard.

Step 6 — Detaching Ribbon




- Place the plastic opening tool underneath the ribbon tab as shown. Gently lift the tab up.
- Gently pull the ribbon from the logic board with tweezers.
- With the ribbon disconnected, the back casing should now be detached from the rest of the camera.

Step 7 — Lens





- Remove the metal casing from the logic board.
- There are three ribbons that connect the lens to the logic board as shown.
- Place the flat end of the spudger underneath one of the black flaps. Carefully lift the flap with the spudger and gently slide the ribbon out.
- Repeat the above process to remove the remaining two ribbons.

Step 8



- Unscrew the four, 3.5mm Phillips screws that hold down the metal plate.

Step 9



- Carefully lift the lens off of the front cover.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
